For all of you passing West Parade in the middle of the shopping centre, it is clear by it's appearance that work has well and truly started on the redevelopment of the library. EG Carter of Gloucester won the contract to extend and refurbish the library and already footings are down for the new enlarged entrance. There is a great deal of work to do and if all goes to plan, our target reopening date is sometime in November.

Prior to the start of building works, Yate Library staff spent many weeks sorting out 38 years worth of accumulated materials. They packed over 750 crates of books and moved everything needed for Yate's temporary premises housed in South Parade. It was very sad to see the building emptied and the photographs below give you some idea of the scene we left.

### Profile of Library Management Board member Carole, Manager of the Volunteer Centre Yate



I was born and raised in Bristol and came to Yate after I was married. I became involved in volunteering as a teenager and enjoyed helping others in the local community. Some of my favourite volunteering roles have been recording taped books for blind people, helping at adult

literacy classes and also at the Riding School for the Disabled. We don't have any children, just two pet hens and in my spare time I love crafting, especially making cards, theatre and film. Recently I studied film at Bristol University and used to have my own community film club in Yate – we even held a Film Festival, which was a lot of fun. After initially pursuing a career in British Telecom, the opportunity arose to take my volunteering further as an assistant to the Centre Manager at Yate, on a six month temporary contract. Within the year my manager left, I took over the role and 12 years later, I am still here!

# Why is volunteering so important to the community?

Volunteering enables you to give something back to the community, whilst allowing a range of organisations, especially charities to benefit from your skills and experience. It can be a great way to meet new people, learn new skills and gain useful experience.

The range of opportunities are huge. Whatever skills and experience you have, there is something that you can do.

The Volunteer Centre acts like a job centre for volunteers, matching up the right people with the right volunteering opportunities, supporting all involved with advice and guidance.

Currently there is a demand for caring roles and befriending, conservation and environment, being committee members or trustees, sharing IT skills and supporting projects in museums and heritage centres.

Our own Best Buddies scheme asks for volunteers to support those with special needs and we also partner the Vinvolved scheme, which specialises in volunteering for 16 – 24s.

This is a great place to meet the public and to find out what is going on in the community.
